Year 2 Newsletter – Friday 22nd March 2024

This week:

In English, the children have continued their unit in English where they began to write a nonchronological report on pirates. The children spent some time reading a modelled write, answering reading comprehension questions before planning and writing their own. They will be encouraged to use all the features of a non-chronological report.

The children have continued using the scheme 'Letter Joins' to learn how to write letters with cursive writing, where all letters start on the line and begin to join some letters. They are assessed each lesson by a number 1, 2 or 3, with 3 being near perfect.

On Wednesday, the children had a Science afternoon where they carried out experiments where they had to predict what might happen then evaluate what happened at the end. The children were encouraged to use Scientific vocabulary in their explanations.

On Thursday, the children had a DT afternoon, where they created their pop-up superheroes. They had a lot of fun with this and finished off the day evaluating their own work and looking at other peoples' pop-ups.

Across the week, the children have taken part in a range of assessments, where they all worked extremely hard and we are utterly proud of their efforts this week.

Next week:

In English, the children will be finishing off their unit on Non-Chronological Reports where they will finish writing their own before editing and publishing it. They will be encouraged to use all the features of a non-chronological report.

In Maths, the children will begin their new unit on Time, where they will focus on telling the time to o'clock, and half past. The children will spend time practically before applying the knowledge pictorially and abstracting. Each lesson they will answer a worded reasoning question linked to the learning that day.

Also, next week the children will have Treat Day, on Wednesday, where they will spend the day completing Easter Activities. On Thursday it will be Break the Rules Day, information about this has already be shared.
